



Exam and Assessment Regulations

*CILEX Professional Qualification
(CPQ)*

Introduction

1. The Exam and Assessment Regulations are in place to protect the integrity of the CILEX Professional Qualification (CPQ) and to ensure the fair treatment of all trainees.

Scope

2. All trainees taking exams and assessments for the CPQ must comply with these Exam and Assessment Regulations.

Exam ID check requirements

3. You are required to show proof of identity when requested by the invigilator, prior to the start of the exam. You must present one item from the following, which must show a photograph and signature:
 - ✓ Current Valid Passport (any nationality)
 - ✓ Current Full or Provisional UK Photo Card Driving Licence
 - ✓ UK Residence Card
4. If you do not have valid ID (as identified above) you must contact CILEX a minimum of 10 working days before your exam in order that alternative exam validation arrangements can be put in place.
5. Trainees, who do not present ID meeting the CILEX identity check requirements, will not be able to sit the exam and will have to pay to sit the exam at a future session.

Exam Timetable

6. All CPQ exams take place at UK time.

Exam Conditions and Regulations

7. You must behave professionally and honestly at all times during the exam and ensure that your conduct does not undermine the integrity of the CPQ.
8. You must take the exam in a private, well-lit room with a workstation (desk/table) free from personal items.
9. The exam is accessed using the TestReach application on your laptop or PC (meeting the laptop/PC requirements set out in the Candidate Guide to TestReach: Sitting CPQ Exams Using TestReach, available on your myCILEX).
10. You are not permitted to access other applications e.g. Microsoft word, outlook, other internet sites or similar during the exam. The exception is A5 Professional and Legal Skills: Legal Research and the Professional Stage exams – see below.

11. You must carry out the pre-exam validation checks in accordance with the remote invigilator's instructions.
12. It is a requirement that you are monitored throughout your exam by the remote invigilator using the webcam on your laptop/PC, and you must comply with the invigilator's instructions. The invigilator may warn you if your actions are considered to infringe the exam conditions.
13. You must only use one monitor/screen. A second monitor is not permitted. The exception to this is A5 Professional and Legal Skills: Legal Research and the Professional Stage exams where trainees are permitted to use a second screen.
14. You must turn off your mobile phone and put it out of reach once connected with the remote invigilator.
15. You are allowed to use the *Permitted Materials and Devices*, as listed below. There should be no unauthorised materials on bookshelves, walls, tables, workstation or similar.
16. You may use your scrap paper in the exams specified in the Permitted Materials and Devices Section below. However, you must not copy exam questions to share with others.
17. You must not take photographs/screenshots/videos or similar of your screen displaying exam questions/content.
18. You must not be interrupted for the duration of the exam and must not communicate with another individual, except for your remote invigilator or the TestReach Support team (see below).
19. Hats or head coverings are not permitted except when worn for religious reasons and only if your full facial features are clearly visible. You are not permitted to wear sunglasses*, smart watches, headphones/headsets or earplugs.
20. You must not block your webcam and are required to remain in full view of your webcam for the duration of the exam, except when taking a toilet break, as set out below.
21. You must not move around the room, except to take a short toilet break, see below.
22. You are permitted to leave your workstation to go to the toilet but must be away for no longer than 5 minutes at any time. The clock will keep running during a toilet break. You should advise the invigilator that you are taking a toilet break. You must not bring anything back into the room if you take a toilet break.
23. You are not permitted to smoke or vape during an exam.
24. If you experience significant technical difficulties in an exam, you may use your mobile phone to contact the TestReach Support team.

**If you have a medical condition which means you need to wear sunglasses, please contact CILEX as soon as possible.*

A5 Professional and Legal Skills: Legal Research

25. Trainees taking A5 Professional and Legal Skills: Legal Research are permitted to access the internet in accordance with the instructions in the live exam. You should be aware that the remote invigilator will be able to see the internet sites you visit during the exam.

Professional Stage Exams P2-P10 – Morning Session – Accessing Pre-release Materials

26. Trainees are provided access to the pre-release materials in the morning of the exam.
27. The morning session is **not** invigilated.
28. Trainees are permitted to make handwritten notes relating to the pre-release materials they review during the morning session.
29. Trainees are not permitted to download or print out the pre-release materials. The pre-release materials will be available in the live afternoon exam.
30. The Exam Conditions and Regulations set out at paragraphs 6, 7, 8, 16, apply to the morning session.

Professional Stage Exams P2-P10 – Afternoon Session – Live Exams

31. The Exam Conditions set out above and the permitted materials and devices set out below apply to the live P2–P10 exams held in the afternoon. It is during the afternoon session live exams that trainees receive and complete the exam tasks.
32. Trainees taking Professional Stage exams are permitted to access the internet in accordance with the instructions in the live exam. You should be aware that the remote invigilator will be able to see the internet sites you visit during the exam.

Permitted materials and devices

33. In addition to the above permitted materials and devices, trainees are allowed additional permitted materials in the following exams.

34. You must ensure that your workstation is cleared of any other items, other than those specified above. The invigilator will request that unauthorised materials are removed.

Non-Compliance with Exam Conditions and Regulations

35. All potential breaches of the Exam Conditions and Regulations are reported to CILEX.
36. CILEX investigates potential breaches of the Exam Conditions and Regulations in accordance with the CILEX Malpractice and Maladministration Policy – CILEX Professional Qualification and CILEX Malpractice and Maladministration Procedure – CILEX Professional Qualification.
37. CILEX will take action in accordance with the CILEX Sanctions Policy – CILEX Professional Qualification, to minimise risks to the integrity of the CPQ and maintain confidence in the qualification.
38. Non-compliance with the Exam Conditions and Regulations may also be a breach of the CILEX Code of Conduct which may be investigated.
39. Examples of Exam and Assessment Violations are set out in Appendix 1.

No shows

40. If you fail to book your remotely invigilated exam slot a minimum of 5 working days in advance of the scheduled exam day you will be considered a no-show and will be required to pay to sit the exam at a future session.
41. If you do not turn up for your exam, you will be considered a no-show and will be required to pay to sit your exam at a future session.
42. If you do not connect to your exam within 30 minutes of the scheduled start time, your exam will expire, and you will not be able to take the exam. In such circumstances you will be recorded as a no-show and will be required to pay to sit your exam at a future session.
43. CILEX will consider requests to sit an exam at a future session for no extra charge if you are affected by adverse circumstances beyond your control at the time of the exam, in accordance with the requirements set out in the Special Consideration Policy – CILEX Professional Qualification and Special Consideration Procedure – CILEX Professional Qualification.

P1 Professional Skills – Assessment Conditions

44. The P1 Professional Skills assessment is a work-based professional report. This assessment does **not** take place under the Exam Conditions and Regulations set out above.
45. Trainees are expected to follow ethical research practices as set out in the P1 Professional Skills Assessment Guidance when conducting their research for the Professional Skills Assessment.
46. Trainees may use Artificial Intelligence (AI) during the research stage, ensuring they mitigate any risks associated with the use of AI. Trainees must not use AI to produce their report.

47. Trainees must not work with other trainees when producing preliminary notes, drafts and final versions of their Professional Skills Assessment.
48. Trainees must not share their work including preliminary notes, drafts and final versions of their Professional Skills Assessment.
49. The report must be the trainee's own, original work. Trainees must sign a declaration of authentication to confirm that the work is their own.
50. All potential breaches of the P1 Professional Skills – Assessment Conditions are investigated by CILEX.

Exam violations

The following list sets out examples of exam violations. This list is not exhaustive and any other actions/behaviours which may compromise the integrity of an exam will be investigated:

- (i) Failing to show valid ID (as identified above).
- (ii) Failing to comply fully with the invigilator's instructions.
- (iii) Having any books e.g. legal textbooks, study books, revision notes, work papers or similar materials or dictionaries in the exam room or attempting to use or using such materials in the exam. The exception is P2-P10 where trainees are permitted to bring in their research notes.
- (iv) Having an unauthorised device in the exam room (e.g. including but not limited to a second laptop/PC, mobile phone, smart watch, portable media player, e-reader, PDA, or similar device).
- (v) Having scrap paper in the following Foundation Stage exams: F1 Legal Systems, F2 Law of Tort, F3 Contract Law or F4 Introduction to Property and Private Client.
- (vi) Having insufficient lighting in the exam room resulting in you not being sufficiently visible.
- (vii) Having a calculator in the exam for which a calculator is not permitted.
- (viii) Accessing or attempting to access other applications for example Word, Excel, windows explorer, files, websites, emails or similar. The exception is A5 Professional and Legal Skills: Legal Research and the Professional Stage exams.
- (ix) Communicating with or attempting to communicate with anyone during the exam. You are only permitted to communicate with the remote invigilator or the TestReach Support team.
- (x) Having another person present in the exam room at any point during an exam.
- (xi) Attempting to copy or copying the work of another individual during an exam.
- (xii) Writing down exam questions to share with others.
- (xiii) Taking photographs/screenshots/videos of your screen displaying exam questions/content.
- (xiv) Leaving your workstation for more than 5 minutes. You are permitted to leave your workstation to go to the toilet but must be away from your workstation for no more than 5 minutes.
- (xv) Bringing anything into the exam room when returning to the room after a toilet break.
- (xvi) Arranging to be impersonated by another individual in an exam.
- (xvii) Accessing confidential exam materials prior to an exam.
- (xviii) Smoking or vaping in the exam room.
- (xix) Using earplugs, headphones, or headsets during the exam.
- (xx) Using multiple screens in an exam with the exception of A5 Professional and Legal Skills: Legal Research and the Professional Stage exams.
- (xxi) Wearing a smartwatch during the exam.
- (xxii) Wearing sunglasses during the exam.
- (xxiii) Wearing a hat or head covering (except when worn for religious reasons), your full facial features must be clearly visible.
- (xxiv) Behaving suspiciously for example, continuously looking around the room or in a particular direction i.e. up/down/left/right, at wrists, or hands.
- (xxv) Opening drawers, cupboards, or other furniture during the exam.
- (xxvi) Inappropriate behaviour, for example, rude, aggressive or threatening behaviour.
- (xxvii) Failing to produce individual and original work for P1 Professional Skills. Plagiarism, which is defined as 'passing off someone else's work as you own either intentionally or unintentionally' is a serious offence.
- (xxviii) Altering or interfering with CILEX assessment documentation, for example, results notifications or certificates.
