Question 1

Reference: Question relates to **Documents 1 and 2** of the case study materials.

In relation to your client, Chandice Williams, you need to deal with the following matters:

- (a) Advise whether Mrs Williams is able to apply to the Family Court for a divorce, the ground for divorce and how this can be satisfied.

 - (b) Explain to Mrs Williams the process of applying for divorce, including the time frame.
(9 marks)
 - (c) Advise of the effect of divorce on pensions and on inheritance and of any action Mrs Williams should take in this respect.

In relation to your client, Tina Sussman, you need to deal with the following matters:

- (a) Explain the options available to Mrs Sussman to resolve financial matters amicably and without recourse to court.

 - (b) Advise Mrs Sussman whether Alex, as an unmarried cohabitant, would be able to make any claims on the family home if it is transferred into her sole name and, if so, what action she should take to prevent a possible claim.

 - (c) Explain to Mrs Sussman what action she could take if Mr Sussman withdraws his agreement to pay voluntary child maintenance payments.

In relation to your client, Richard Potter, you need to deal with the following matters:

- (a) Advise Mr Potter which s8 Children Act 1989 order he can apply for to resolve the difficulties that he is having in seeing his children and the basis on which he can apply.

For the purpose of Question 2(b) below, assume that Mr Potter instructs you to make the application required.

- (b) Advise Mr Potter of the likely outcome of his application, with reference to the factors that the court will consider in deciding whether to grant this order.

- (c) Explain to Mr Potter the nature of a Family Assistance Order and how it could help with his difficulties in seeing Bella and Flora.
