Litigation and Advocacy Rights

Under the Legal Services Act, authorisation is required to carry out reserved services including:

- Conduct of Litigation.
- Rights of Audience in Chambers and Open Court.

Advocacy Rights

CILEx Lawyer

CILEx Regulation's scheme to gain Litigation and Advocacy Rights* is open to Chartered Legal Executives / CILEx Fellows.

Additional qualifications are required for Advocacy Rights:

- 2 day course for Chambers.
- 6 day course for Open Court Family Proceedings.

Upon authorisation, Members can use the title CILEx Litigator and Advocate and can provide the full range of Family Proceedings and Advocacy services without supervision by an Authorised Person.

All reserved and regulated legal services must be delivered through a regulated legal practice. CILEx Regulation is one of the core approved regulators under the Legal Services Act who can regulate law firms.

*Applications for Advocacy qualifications and authorisation as a stand-alone are available. Completion of the BPTC may offer exemptions from the advocacy course.
